



## What is the Advanced Manufacturing Skills 2 Manufacturing Program?

The aim of the Advanced Manufacturing Skills 2 Manufacturing Program is to support Tasmanian-based advanced manufacturing to undertake non-accredited training activities that will support the development of the advanced manufacturing workforce.

## What is available?

The program provides grants of up to a 50 per cent contribution towards non-accredited training, subject to the applicant contributing at least 50 per cent of the project costs.

Maximum grant assistance is \$15 000. A total funding pool of \$200 000 is available in 2021-22, \$200 000 in 2022-23 and \$200 000 in 2023-24.

## Eligibility

The program is open to Tasmanian based advanced manufacturing enterprises with an annual sales turnover greater than \$300 000 and less than \$20 million. Eligible projects include short courses, product or industry specific training and safety awareness training. To be eligible, project expenditure cannot be retrospective and cannot include costs such as capital expenditure, salaries and wages, general operational expenditure.
