Hi Kevin, as discussed, observations and comments from site inspection ML 1M/2019 D & K Hayes Derby.

The following observations were made during a site inspection of Mining Lease ML 1M/2019 D & K Hayes at Derby on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2020. The inspection was undertaken by Kevin Robinson and I, escorted by lessee Mr Derek Hayes:

- The principle resource at the site is sand derived from the historic Briseis Tin Mine, which is located in three large heaps. The sand resource is effectively already sorted in to two main products, clean bedding sand and a finer grained sand product (adjacent to the recently constructed Works Depot) potentially suitable for other construction purposes including concrete. The bedding sand (located in the centre of the lease) has been used throughout the region on a number of irrigation projects. The resource is freely dug and requires no pre-processing before use making is a very attractive product for consumers. The sand resource is significant and is likely to continue at depth across the lease area to greater than 80m.
- The secondary resource at the site is basalt hard rock 'mullock heaps', consisting of oversize armour rock
  and in situ basalt that includes 'hopperings' (a basalt cobble/clay mix used as road base). Both products are
  freely extracted and require no pre-processing. The lessee has also previously had small quantities of the
  basalt crushed to various aggregates to meet consumer demand.
- In general the resources at the site are unique in that they require no pre-processing and can be sold straight to market. Making the resource very affordable and readily available to local markets. The resource is extracted with a wheel loader or excavator and loaded directly into truck & trailer for transport to markets.
- The site is very well maintained with minimal weeds and no off-site impacts.
- It was observed that the recently constructed Dorset Council Works Depot significantly encroaches onto the mining lease, directly hindering access to the adjacent resource. The following concerns were raised by the lessee and on inspection verified by Kevin and myself.
- The lessee, Mr Derek Hayes, raised concerns with regards to encroachment onto the mining lease of the recently constructed Dorset Council Works Depot. In particular Mr Hayes raised concerns with regards to the following:
  - The Works Depot and boundary fence encroaches onto the mining lease and restricts access to the southern resource as the road is not suitable for heavy vehicles and impedes extraction of the resource due to the proximity of the fence/depot;
  - o Discharge from the wash-down bay reports directly onto the mining lease;
  - The wastewater system reports to the mining lease;
  - The TasWater connection crosses through the mining lease.
